The girls were gutted and are determined to redeem themselves in the upcoming season. The outstanding talent of our players did not go unrecognised, with Bianca Ortiz-Pallen nominated for BUCS' Fans Player of the Year, and with five of our

After a year of zoom socials and number restrictions, we were finally able to organize our weekly socials in their full form this season! Socials have been a really important part of the season to integrate all the girls across our three teams, and also for celebrating some great wins. A highlight was definitely our annual 'Iron Man' social, where freshers battle through elimination rounds to be crowned as the Iron Man (congratulations Libby Hall!). We have also enjoyed beach trips and club meals which have been great for getting to know each other and have created a cohesive club atmosphere. We are now looking forward to our tour to Prague at the beginning of June as a way to celebrate the end to a fantastic season. This should provide the girls with a perfect opportunity to relax and unwind from all their hardwork both on and off the pitch this year.



This season saw the first year of in-person welfare, as the role was established last year during the Covid-19 pandemic and was therefore restricted to online. Our welfare officers this year were Phoebe Tebb and Ana Martinez-Bailey who were able to provide key support to DUWRFC members. We found that having two welfare officers was highly beneficial, as it helped with task management and promoted more nuanced and informed conversations around wellbeing and best approaches, while at the same time maintaining confidentiality, safety, and autonomy within the role.

One of the main avenues for support we offered were weekly drop-in sessions that members could attend to exchange with others, give general updates and receive welfare information, support and/or signposting. While Ana was in London on her placement year, she held these sessions online, whilst Phoebe's were in person. This meant players had more than one person to speak to and various options for communication to choose from. While these drop-in sessions were usually community-based, with many players attending together, there were also options for 1-on-1 support, which numerous DUWRFC members made use of to seek tailored support throughout their time in the club and at the university. Moreover, we produced an online Welfare Reporting Form, through which players could anonymously report anything or simply share information they felt Welfare should be aware of, as well as give feedback and suggestions for improvement. It also included a comprehensive and information-rich document signposting various mental

health resources and ways of seeking support, including local charities, University services and more. However, Welfare was not just people sharing personal struggles or seeking support, but also team-bonding: we organised a few social activities, including picnics and brunches, to bring everyone together in a calm, supportive and fun environment. In general, we both thoroughly enjoyed being Welfare Officers, we feel that this role was a success and hope that we managed to support our DUWRFC family and give back to this fantastic club that has brought us so much joy and love over the past years.

We are currently looking forward to our end of season celebrations, where girls will be awarded prizes for their achievements this season. We will then look to preseason where the new teams will begin to gear up and bond as we approach the new season. We have a few ideas coming in for activities during this time, which include a sponsored hike, if this might interest you!
